

**SCHOLARSHIP FUND RULES OF THE
CORRECTION CAPTAINS ASSOCIATION, INC.
CITY OF NEW YORK**

The Correction Captains' Association Inc. has decided to dedicate the proceeds of fund raising activities to provide college scholarships for its members' (both active and retired) children.

The President and the Executive Board will accept from the members a copy of their child's SAT score (or if no SAT was taken, the lowest equivalent ACT score) as an application to participate in the Scholarship Fund. The President and the Executive Board shall make and may amend the rules for Scholarship Fund. Their decisions relating to the Scholarship Fund shall be final and binding.

Eligibility to Participate

An active or retired member in good standing shall be eligible to participate in the Scholarship Fund.

Scholarship Eligibility Requirement

The member's unmarried dependent child/children up to 19 years of age, "Child or Children" are defined as (1) any of your biological or legally adopted children, or (2) one for whom you have acquired legal guardianship through a court order, who lives with you on a full time basis and is solely dependent on you for support. Children of RDPs are not eligible dependents unless the member is the biological or adoptive parent.

Application process

The applications for a scholarship must be received in the Correction Captains' Association Inc. office by June 1.

Criteria

Applications which are determined to be eligible to receive a scholarship shall be ranked in order of their SAT scores (or if no SAT was taken, the lowest equivalent ACT scores). Applicants are required to submit proof of enrollment in an accredited college or university.

Number and Amount of Scholarships

The President and the Executive Board shall determine the number and amount of the Scholarships, each taking into account the amount of monies available.
