



# World Trade Center (WTC) Health Program

## Apply Today!

### Am I an eligible responder?

#### Did you Work or Volunteer to provide:

rescue, recovery, demolition, debris cleanup, and support services related to the September 11, 2001 attacks on the World Trade Center (*including NYPD & FDNY responders*) in the following locations:

- Lower Manhattan (south of Canal Street)
- Ground Zero
- Staten Island Landfill
- NYC Chief Medical Examiner's Office
- and the barge loading piers?

#### If so, you may be eligible for FREE WTC Health Program benefits:

- Annual medical examinations
- Treatment services for approved health conditions that cause problems like:
  - Trouble breathing with wheezing, like asthma
  - Being less able to do what you normally do without becoming short of breath
  - Frequent sinus problems or a constant cough
  - Frequent nose and throat irritation
  - Stress related illness, anxiety, and depression
- Medications for WTC-related health conditions

## What do I do next?

**Step 1: Apply for the program.** Get a copy of the application by calling 1-888-982-4748 or visit our website at [www.cdc.gov/wtc](http://www.cdc.gov/wtc).

**Step 2: Make an appointment.** If you are determined to be eligible, a medical provider will contact you to make an appointment for your first medical exam. During your medical exam, you will be evaluated by doctors who have years of experience in treating WTC Health Program members and WTC-related illnesses.

**Step 3: WTC Health Program doctors will determine if you have WTC-related health conditions.** You may then be eligible to receive WTC Health Program benefits. The clinic where you receive your exam will explain the full range of program benefits available to you.

## Where do I get care?

The WTC Health Program has multiple clinic locations to serve you.

**Brooklyn – Manhattan – Queens – Staten Island – Long Island – New Jersey**

*(Locations are also available outside of the New York City metro area)*

The Program also provides benefits for eligible people who were present, lived, worked, or went to school in the New York City disaster area (south of Houston Street and any block in Brooklyn that is within a 1.5-mile radius of the former World Trade Center site).
